Work on the economic evaluation of health policies and health sector reform in several Latin American countries for the Interamerican Development Bank (IDB) and World Bank as a part-time independent consultant. Previously senior adviser in Uruguay at the Ministries of Economy and Finance, Ministry of Health and the Office of Management and Budget of the Presidency. The project aims at producing a new scorecard type regional report on CVD and NCD health risks (tobacco, alcohol, unhealthy diets, sedentarism, air pollution) and prepare country reports for 10 countries with policy recommendations from the civil society's perspective.
- **Phase I.** Led work on the preparation of questionnaires, wrote a report on the implementation of NCD control policies and their associated health risks for 12 LAC countries (2017-2018).
